

It allows students enrolled at any one of them to take courses at the other two at no extra charge, and to apply the credits toward graduation requirements at the home campus. Through Tri-College, you can access world-class programs, resources such as full access to all three libraries, and the benefits of a "combined campus" of around 27,000 students. Meanwhile, you can live and learn in an environment sized to suit you: a Division I school with about 14,400 students, a Division II school with an enrollment of around 7,500, or a Division III school with approximately 2,700.

Concordia's program distinctions

Concordia is a nationally recognized leader in global education known for its high ranking in study abroad program participation and the world-renowned Concordia Language Villages. The college ranks in the top 12 percent for graduates who go on to earn research doctorates. The medical school acceptance rate for Concordia graduates is 88 percent, and the law school acceptance rate is above 90 percent.

Bikers, bladers and skaters are rolling at the Fargo Skate Park, a formed-concrete facility that is open dawn to dusk and has challenges for beginner, intermediate and advanced athletes. Four disc golf courses will keep your head spinning with a smile. They're just part of the metro area's extensive park system, which includes 99 miles of biking and hiking trails, dozens of golf courses, softball, baseball, tennis, swimming and cross-country skiing facilities. If you're in for the long run, the annual Fargo Marathon, a Boston Marathon qualifier, is building an overwhelmingly positive national reputation. And let's not forget, Fargo Moorhead is in the midst of open prairies with beautiful Minnesota lake country and pine forests only an hour down the road. If you like to hike, mountain bike, canoe, fish, camp or (insert your favorite outdoor activity), you can do it here.

Fargo Moorhead's public parks encompass more than 3,000 acres (about five square miles), an area approximately 3.5 times larger than New York City's Central Park.

Commutes here are a snap; wherever you are, it doesn't take long to get where you're going. You can get to your classes, the clinic, supermarket, a movie, your part-time job or your internship in just minutes.
